# TAYLOR RETIRES FROM MNRF FISHERIES ADVISORY COUNCIL



Robert Taylor announced his retirement from the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forests (MNRF) Fisheries Advisory Council for Region 17 in December 2017. The Advisory Council participates in fisheries management by sharing ideas and expertise with MNRF, by helping to develop and implement strategies, and by communicating with the local angling community. Robert was named co-chair of the Council in 2007 and held the position until retirement.

In 2005, in an effort to improve walleye fishing in Crowe Lake, Robert organized a contingent of Lake Stewards and Municipal Councilors to make presentations to the MNRF and the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters (OFAH). Robert was invited to sit on the newly formed Fisheries Advisory Council in 2006, with Norma Taylor as his alternate. It was as a direct result of Robert's tenacity, and the support he generated from OFAH, that Crowe Lake was selected for the walleye stocking program. Four stocking cycles resulted in approximately 100,000 walleye fingerlings being added to Crowe Lake. The MNRF has recognized on numerous occasions that the dedication and logistical support provided by Robert and Norma played a key role in the success of the program.

Robert served on the CLWA Board for many years. He was involved, usually with the assistance of Norma, in lake capacity studies, testing for invasive species, working on winter and summer fishing derbies for 7 years, and putting up membership signs on Cook Road.

The CLWA Board, on behalf of all CLWA members and everyone who fishes for the elusive walleye, thank Robert and Norma for their dedication and efforts.

The Municipality is excited to announce it will welcome a new doctor to the Marmora Medical Centre as part of the Central Hastings Family Health within the next year. Payman Charkhzarin, a resident medical student at the University of Ottawa, is the eleventh doctor to sign with Hastings County's Family Physician Recruitment Program. The initiative provides financial incentives to doctors who agree to practice medicine in Hastings County for a minimum of five years.

"I am very excited to be coming back to Hastings County to begin my practice," said Charkhzarin who did a placement in the area during his third year of studies. "I feel a strong connection to the area after my positive experiences here." Charkhzarin will finish his residency next year before settling in Marmora to practice family medicine alongside Dr Melissa Holowaty.

## MESSAGE IN A BOTTLE

Not the song by The Police or the movie with Kevin Costner, but the program sponsored by the Lions Club.

The Message in a Bottle program, sponsored locally by the Marmora Crowe Valley Lions Club, is a simple idea designed to encourage people to keep their personal and medical details on a standard form and in a common location – the fridge.

The bottle is kept in the fridge, where the emergency services will be able to find it in the event of being called to your home. They will know you have a bottle by the two labels displayed on the inside of the front door to your home and on the door of your fridge.

This scheme is free to the user. While it is focused on the more vulnerable people in our community, anyone can fall downstairs, so this scheme can benefit anyone, including you.

As a minimum it will save the Emergency Services valuable time identifying you and your emergency contacts. By telling whether you have special medication or allergies or not, it is a potential lifesaver and provides peace of mind to users and their friends and families.

Bottles are free of charge and are available at the Marmora Medical Centre.

## Earth Day:

### Raising Awareness on Climate Crisis

This April 22 will mark the 48<sup>th</sup> Earth Day held in the United States and the 28<sup>th</sup> Canadian Earth Day. You can thank a US Senator named Gaylord Nelson for that. After a 1969 oil spill in Santa Barbara, California, Nelson sought to mobilize the politically active student community for a national “teach-in” on the environment.

He chose April 22, 1970 as the day (falling between spring break and final exams). Over 20 million Americans took to the streets, campuses, parks and other public spaces to demonstrate in support of the environment.

Earth Day went global in 1990 and saw the mobilization of 200 million in 141 countries (Canada being one of them with 2 million people turning out) demonstrating on behalf of the environment. The largest secular observance in the world, Earth Day is now celebrated by more than 2 Billion people worldwide.

## Drowning Prevention Backyard Rivers and Lakes

from Parachute

Drowning happens quickly and silently. It often happens when a child just slips under the water. A young child can drown in as little as 2.5 centimeters (one inch) of water in just seconds.

Drowning is the second leading cause of death for Canadian children. Most deaths of children aged one to four are in home pools, especially when they are not supervised. Forty-two percent of children who drowned in the last 10 years did not have an adult watching them. Children of all ages are at greatest risk of drowning in rivers, lakes, and ponds.

Stay within sight and reach of your child when in, on or around water. Adults should stand within an arm's reach of any child under five, or any child who does not swim well, when they are in the water or playing near the water.

Learn how to swim or have your child supervised by an experienced adult. Learn first aid and CPR. Make sure there is an experienced swimmer with your child whenever they are in or around the water. If your child happened to slip into the water, it is necessary to have an experienced swimmer present to quickly get the child out of the water and perform CPR, if necessary.

Young children and weak swimmers must wear lifejackets when in, on or around the water or on a boat. Lifejackets provide extra protection to your child. However, you still must supervise closely because life-jacket do not prevent drowning.

Put your child in swimming lesson. It is best to ensure that children have training but it is important to not assume that it provides them with special protection. Supervision is critical, even if your child is or was in swimming lessons.

Teach your children about the currents in lakes and rivers and about all water safety rules. It will help them to better understand why they can't do certain things when they are in or around the water.

# Fisheries Monitoring Program Results for Crowe Lake

The Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry collects information from representative lakes in fisheries management zones across the province to help biologists manage fisheries effectively. The Broad-scale Fisheries Monitoring Program Bulletin provides a snapshot of recent monitoring activities and netting results.

The sampling approach allows MNRF to measure and evaluate the health of Ontario's lakes and their fish communities, and track changes through time over broad areas of Ontario. To learn more about the sampling program visit [www.ontario.ca/fishing](http://www.ontario.ca/fishing).

Fish populations were surveyed using large and small mesh nets to provide information on fish species present and their characteristics, such as growth, age, and abundance. The catch data (depicted in the chart below) show species surveyed in large mesh nets in both netting periods.

# Plastic Grocery Bags

"I was working the register at Trader Joe's in Brooklyn a few years ago when a customer came up with a handful of 99-cent reusable bags. She was buying about ten of them for gifts; when I finished ringing her up, I put nine of the bags neatly inside the tenth and handed them to her. She looked at me like I was trying to give her five pounds of loose egg yolks to carry.

No, I need a bag, she said.

But you have a bag; I said, ten, actually.

But I need a bag for the bags, she insisted. I pushed back as far as friendly Trader Joe's customer service would allow but then relented, putting her ten reusable bags in a plastic bag.

Working at a grocery store revealed to me just how deep single-use bag addiction runs. People double- and triple-bag small items, they say they'll remember their reusable bags "next time" but never do, they ask for a handful of extra plastic bags to cover up their grocery bag so no one spies on their stuff on the bus (a lot of people are paranoid about this, apparently). They put their groceries in a plastic bag only to put that bag inside a backpack, which, it turns out, was a bag all along."

The average use lifespan of a plastic bag is all of about 12 minutes. Then that bag essentially exists forever: it can take 500 to 1,000 years to break down.

### Fisheries Act & Navigable Waters Protection Reforms.

In February 2018, after extensive consultations pursuant to Canada’s Review of Environmental and Regulatory Processes, the federal government tabled legislation intended to ensure that the Fisheries Act provides “strong and meaningful” protection for fish and fish habitat, and improves certainty for industry.

Bill C-68 was introduced to “restore lost protections and incorporate modern safeguards.” Learn more at <https://foca.on.ca/fisheries-act-revisions-overview/>.

### Economic Potential of Waterfront Owners.

In January 2018, official notice was provided to FOCA of funding received through Ontario’s Rural Economic Development (RED) program to gather data on the local economic potential of waterfront property owners in rural communities.

Hundreds of respondents have provided their input to the project survey. A final report will be released by FOCA this Spring.

### Rural Services – Broadband.

The Government of Canada created “Connecting Canadians” so that citizens in rural, remote and northern parts of the country can enjoy improved access to high-speed broadband access.

# Let's Grow Marmora

In the summer of 2017, there were 6 raised beds planted with veggies and flowers in the bump out of the parking lot on the corner of Burstall Street and #7.

Building on that success, 6 more are planned, making a total of 12. Each bed is 4' by 10'. There is lots of sun, good soil and a tank of water for use with the beds. If you would like to rent a raised bed for \$10 for the season of 2018, call Norma 613 472-2157.

How about planting around your place? Be creative! Repurpose a container. Mix flowers, herbs and veggies with the tallest ones at the back or middle. You never have too many herbs!

Put wheels or rollers on the bottom of the container and use the sun when you need it or wheel it into the shade. If your container is too deep, create a false bottom. Try growing squash on a trellis.

Protect your crop from groundhogs and squirrels. Some beans like to climb up on strings or poles. Snoop around garden centres for ideas. M and L library has some current books with growing tips. Enjoy!


