CLWA Implements E-Pay CLWA

Thanks to the efforts of CLWA Webmaster Dave Savournin and CLWA Treasurer Elinor White, we can now offer *E-Pay CLWA* for electronic payment of membership fees and donations using the CLWA website and on-line banking. We are very pleased to offer this convenience to people who want to become new members or want to renew their membership using on-line technology and do not want to write and mail a check. We explored many different possibilities and have found a process that seems to be easy to do, is reasonably priced, and available to most people.

It is a two-step process. First, you transfer money from your bank account to the CLWA bank account using your bank's Interac procedures. Then, you send an email to the CLWA Treasurer with the transfer information and the membership form as an attachment to it. Instructions on the CLWA website www.clwa.ca will guide people through the process.

The Bog

The spring runoff on Crowe Lake brought with it an invasion of large mats of cattails and bulrushes. Some of these mini-islands were longer than 3 or 4 pontoon boats and one even had a small tree with a bird's nest. But when they washed up against the shoreline they were a very serious problem. We had a lot of email and questions about what could be done to manage this hazard. We made a number of telephone calls and did some research.




The MNRF and the CVCA will not regulate your actions to remove this debris and will not require a permit for your removal of such material. Removal of the material by mechanical means such as rakes, cutter bars or harvester is exempt but not removal by dredging.

However, that could change once it takes root and is growing. You can only conduct work on shore lands directly in front of your property.

Debris and material that floats up to your shoreline is considered invasive and you have a great deal of freedom to deal with it.

You may also want to discuss the project with neighbours, before starting work.

Marmora School To Get \$4.5 Million Renovation and Consolidation

The Earl Prentice Public School (currently JK to Grade 3) and the Marmora Senior Public School (currently Grade 4 to 8) will be consolidated in March 2018 on the Marmora Senior site. In September 2017: Marmora Senior Public School will remain grades 4 to 8 and students who normally go to Marmora Senior will go there as usual. Earl Prentice will remain JK to Grade 3 and students who normally go to Earl Prentice will go there in September, as usual. In March 2018, it is anticipated that Earl Prentice students will move to the renovated consolidated school. Funding for this project resulted from a capital priority business case submitted to the Ministry of Education in the summer of 2015.

The project at the Senior Public School:

- Construction of additions to the existing building, including five new classrooms and a new double-size gym;
- Modifications/renovations to the existing building, including a new front entrance, main office, and converting the existing gym to a learning commons/library;
- Building renewal work to replace the heating/ventilation equipment, electrical and communication systems (telephone, data, public address and security), interior/exterior doors and interior finishes, and a new bus loop at the front of the building;

There has been a lot of discussion about the vacant Earl Prentice school building. Representatives from M&L Council have met or talked with municipalities that have converted vacant school buildings to community use. It does not appear to be economically feasible for M&L to use the building for community purposes. The estimated cost of repair and renovation and the annual maintenance costs are beyond the budget of the municipality without significant tax increases.

New in Marmora

Community Hub Opened: A new community center opened on June 2nd on the second floor of the Library. The Community Hub will provide space for a variety of community services to the residents of Marmora and Lake who may face barriers that restrict access to resources offered in Belleville and Trenton. The Hub will offer three private office spaces and a conference room to enable service providers to come to Marmora periodically to meet the needs of the citizens of Marmora in a central more accessible location.

ServiceOntario Reopened: The office formerly located in Leo's at 12 Forsythe Street closed but it has moved to the Marmora Tourism Centre and reopened in early June.

Marmora Historical Society To Be Moved: The second floor of the Marmora Public Library will be the new home of the Marmora Historical Society. Moving day is unknown at this time (1 June).

Marmora Merchant Market Opens

The building has been known as the Gladney Building and the Lynch Building. The earliest record indicates the building has been in existence since 1883.

The Market is the home of the Marmora Flea Market. It will be open weekends year-round 8 AM to 2 PM. Plans are for it to be a destination offering goods produced by local artisans, bakers and farmers. They are looking for merchants selling jewelry and accessories, antique clothing, antiques, fresh seasonal produce, toys and games, reclaimed wood furniture, and natural skin care products. 



M&L Budget Includes Shannon Bridge and Marble Point Road



The Don Shannon Bridge on Cordova Road will get repairs costing \$753,000 this summer. Starting in late- May, Cordova Road will be closed and traffic will detour via Riverview Crescent. There will be a temporary traffic signal at the one-lane bridge on Riverview Crescent. The No Jumping From the Bridge rules will be strictly enforced.

Also in the 2017 M&L Budget for the Highway Department is \$560,000 for road reconstruction, hard top and gravel. Part of this will be used for work on Marble Point Road.



A Solar Eclipse will cross the North American continent in August. It will be seen as a Total or a Partial Eclipse depending on your viewing location. The Total phase will be visible in a narrow path spanning all across the USA from the East Coast to the West Coast. In the Marmora area, people will see a Partial Eclipse. It will be visible, weather permitting, from 1:14 PM to 3:50 PM.

- Global Type: Total Solar Eclipse
- Marmora & Lake: Partial Solar Eclipse
- Begins: Mon, Aug 21, 2017 at 1:14 pm
- Maximum: Mon, Aug 21, 2017 at 2:34 pm
- Ends: Mon, Aug 21, 2017 at 3:50 pm
- Duration: 2 hours, 35 minutes
